

Finland

Finland is the sixth largest country in Europe in terms of area. After Iceland and Norway, Finland is the most sparsely populated country in Europe with only 17 inhabitants per square km. Approximately 67 per cent of the 5.3 million people live in urban areas. During the summer, it never gets really dark, and in the north the sun does not set at all for some time. During the winter months, there are six hours of full daylight in the south while for two months in the far north, the sun never rises above the horizon. Finland is also traditionally known for its high level of technology and outstanding architecture and design.

Master's Programme in Industrial Management

The Master's Programme in Industrial Management is oriented in the field of International Technology Management. The areas taught in the programme cover the basics of technology forecasting, design management, international sourcing and manufacturing, sustainable development, and technology integration. Other topics of Industrial Management such as logistics and quality management also support the studies. The two-year programme includes two fields of specialisation: technology management (material and production technology) or design management.

The programme leads to a Master of Science in Economics and Business Administration degree, and it can be completed in two years. The Master's programme prepares students to apply their knowledge in high-tech companies and business with rapidly changing core technologies, in research centres and universities, and in developing regional and national technology policies. During the programme, students have the opportunity to gain practical experience of technology management in industries because of the University's close cooperation with several companies in the area.



The City of Vaasa

The City of Vaasa is located on the west coast of Finland. Its position at the narrowest point of the Gulf of Bothnia makes it an important link between Finland and Sweden. The closest city is Umeå in Sweden (70 km). Vaasa is a distinctively international city, second only to the capital Helsinki in the number of foreigners per capita. In this bilingual city of 58 000 inhabitants, one out of four people is Swedish speaking. With its 12 000 students, Vaasa is also a lively student city.

The teaching and research activities of the University focus on business studies, administration, languages, culture and communication, and technology. About 11 percent of the students are international students from all around the world.

Admission

To apply to the Master's Programme in Industrial Management, you should have completed a Bachelor's degree in the field of business administration or technology.

The required documents needed to apply for the Master's programme are:

- Application form (generated by the electronic system)
- Passport photo
- Degree certificate(s)/certificate(s) of previous studies
- Transcript of university records
- Recommendation by 1-2 professors/employers
- CV
- Photocopy of passport's information page
- Certificate of language proficiency
- Letter of motivation

Admission is based on the following areas:

- Bachelor's degree of the applicant
- Language proficiency
- Motivation of the applicant
- Relevant work experience
- International experience

There are no entrance examinations for international Master's programmes. Admission decisions are made on the basis of the required documents, selecting candidates with the best qualifications.

Master's degree students have no tuition fees. Students are required to pay the Student Union membership fee of approximately 100.00 euros annually.

The application period for all programmes is from January 1 to February 28 annually.
